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DEBRA society of a bullous epidermolysis patients was founded 22 years ago and has a number of activities behind it to help the patients and their families. They act as a humanitarian association, and work is based on the principle of assistance and comprehensive care; it is a part of Rare Recoursenet and has so-called ONE STOP SHOP which is designed to provide complementary, comprehensive health and social care and support to patients.

Disease occurs at birth, with no cure for it. Infants (so called "children butterflies") have a fragile and sensitive skin that is prone to wounds and bladders throughout the body and mucous membranes. This very rare disease has also a number of complications that are only prevented by timely response and regular hospital controls.

Polyclinic of Barometry and Occupational Health OXY is a private, specialized health care institution operating in the field of hyperbaric medicine. The basic activity is the use of oxygen that is inhaled at elevated pressure (hyperbaric oxygen) for the treatment of diseases where oxygen deficiency is an important part of the overall illness.

By incorporating hyperbaric oxygen for wound treatment that does not respond to existing classical methods of medical / surgical care, a significant increase in tissue oxygenation in the tissue of poorly wound and infected wounds is achieved, and it causes significant positive changes in the wound healing process. Treatment with HBO2 stimulates wound healing by direct stimulation of fibroblast multiplication, collagen synthesis and neovascularization processes.

The "Sveti Duh" Clinical Hospital, owned by the City of Zagreb is the oldest in Croatia. It started working in 1804 and has a continuous tradition. Today, the hospitals participate in the health care network, with 500 adult beds and 70 newborn beds, and with the total capacity of specialist-conciliar healthcare and specialist diagnostics, which is made up of about 120 ambulances and diagnostic services. The hospital is organized as a unique technological unit consisting of 9 stationary activities and 16 specialist-conciliar and diagnostic activities organized in 6 clinics and 8 institutes and Central Emergency Reception. Hospital Clinics and Hospitals are nominally organized in accordance with the valid nomenclature of hospital and specialist-conciliar healthcare and specialist diagnostics.

Chronic wounds are a growing problem in developed countries because they affect the overall functioning of an individual as well as the environment. Their growth is estimated as well as the increase in the incidence of major diseases directly related to the occurrence of chronic wounds. Such a wound requires a multidisciplinary approach to disposal. Part will be displayed at the Surgery Clinic in the plastic surgeon's surgery "Sveti Duh", with emphasis on the decubitus, but also due to the type of patients who are caught in the ambulance.

The physician and nurse will present the algorithm of their daily work and talk about their experiences, present information about Croatia, and answer questions.

Sisters of Charity teaching Hospital is one of the oldest hospitals and biggest in Croatia.

It was established in 1846, through the initiative of the Archbishop of Zagreb. It changed locations a number of times until a permanent hospital campus was completed in 1894 It was run by the Sisters of Charity from 1894 until 1948. The Emperor Franz Joseph visited the hospital in 1895. The Sisters continued to run the hospital until it was confiscated after World War II. Thereafter it was nationalized by the Communist government (in 1948) and renamed. The original name was restored in 1992, but the government retained its ownership. It is now operated under the Ministry of Health.

As of 2007, the hospital consists of 13 clinics and 7 specialized institutes, with a total of 853 beds and 2,334 employees in one campus. The hospital is an educational facility for institutes of higher education, i.e., the medical and dental schools, as well as a school for nurses.

Besides diagnostics, treatment, medical rehabilitation and health care, specialist and consulting activity is performed with assured laboratory and other diagnostic activity.

It has also an extensive teaching and learning program that takes place on several levels. The Department of Dental, Medical, Pharmacy - Biochemical, Philosophical, Educational and Rehabilitation, Healthcare University organizes and conducts undergraduate and postgraduate studies for students of these faculties and polytechnics.

Seventeen reference centers of the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Croatia are operating in the hospital. In 2010, the following institutions were added: Tumor Clinic Zagreb and Clinic for Traumatology Zagreb.

The Reference Center of the Ministry of Health for Chronic Wounds is located at the Department of Surgery and the Clinic for Skin and Sex Diseases based on the achieved scientific and professional results in the monitoring, teaching, prevention, therapy and rehabilitation of chronic wounds corresponding to world standards. Two lectures (dermatological and surgical treatment of chronic wounds) were arranged and a practical overview of innovative methods for treating patients in the department. The emphasis is on algorithms, diagnostic screening methods and nursing education.

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Practicalities of 1st Transnational Meeting

Healthcare

Holders of a valid European health Insurance card (EHIC) have the right to access state –provided healthcare during a temporary stay in Croatia.

The EHIC covers treatment that is medically necessary until your planned return home. Treatment should be provided on the same basis as it would to a resident of that country, either at a reduced cost or, in many cases, for free.

The EHIC is not an alternative to travel insurance. It will not cover any private medical healthcare costs.

Currency and Cash

The Croatian currency is Kuna (Kn). There are 100 lipa to the kuna. Notes come in denominations of 5 kuna, 10 kuna, 20 kuna, 50 kuna, 100 kuna, 200 kuna, 500 kuna, 1000 kuna. Coins come in 10 lipa, 20 lipa, 50 lipa, 1 kuna, 2 kune, 5 kuna.

Credit and debit cards are accepted almost everywhere. There are lots of ATM machines and it is usually free to withdraw cash (although you may be charged a fee by your provider). Many ATM machines also have different language options.
