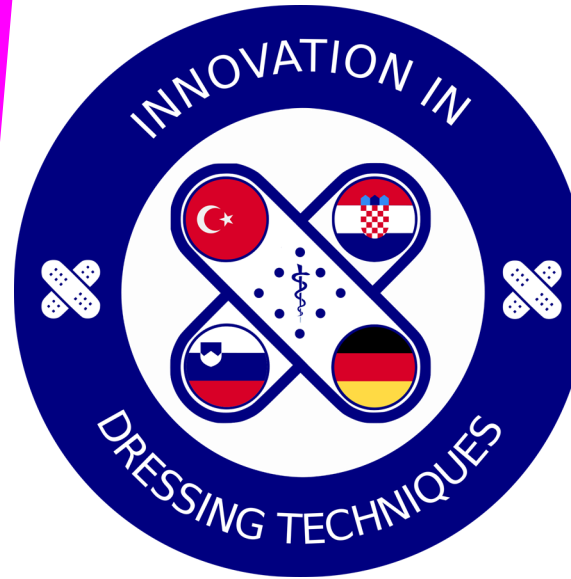


Project Aims

Learning/ Teaching / Training Activities

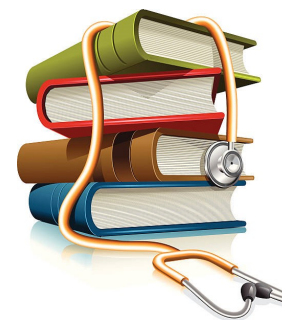
Activity was held between 06-01-2020 / 11-01-2020 in Amasya / Turkey . The activity was attended by 10 students and 2 accompanying teachers, 5 students from the partners of Škola za medicinske sestre Vrapče (Croatia) and Srednja zdravstvena sola Ljubljana (Slovenia). Within the activity foreign students had experience in dressing and wound care techniques in Turkey.



Based on learning outcomes and innovative practice, student-centered pedagogical approaches to nursing education was used, resulting in innovation in terms of overall patient care and infection prevention and "reduction in suffering". Appropriate assessment and certification methods were used for the project and Europass certificate were provided. With project internalization, learners have reached the capacity to use management governance, while entrepreneurial, multilingual, and institutions that recognize different cultures.

The Intellectual Output: Manual on Dressing Techniques

A book on dressing techniques and wound care was prepared as the intellectual output of the project . The book was produced in collaboration with 4 partners.



In the book which consists of about 100 pages;

1-Decubitus

2- Diabetic Foot Wounds

3- Atypical Wounds

4- Arterial and Venous Ulcers

were examined in depth and each country will put their practical studies and techniques related to these types of wounds. The book was published in English and each country will then translate it into its own language.
